What's that? A Cravat!

A modern take on a traditional neck accessory.

Materials

Yarn: 1 skein—Sweet Georgia CashLuxe Fine 400yds/100g Needle: 32" or longer US6

Finished Size & Gauge

Approx. 66" x 11" blocked 19 sts=4" in garter

Instructions

Cast on 3 stitches.

Set Up

Row 1: (RS) Kfb, K1, Kfb (5 sts)

Row 2: Kfb, Kfb, PM, K1, PM, Kfb, Kfb (9 sts)

Body Pattern

Row 1: Kfb, Knit to 1 stitch before marker, Kfb, SM, K1, SM, Kfb, Knit to last stitch, Kfb (increase 4)

Note: It's helpful to mark your RS row so you know which side has the center increases.

Row 2: Kfb, Knit to last stitch, Kfb (increase 2)

Repeat rows 1 and 2 of body pattern until you have 267 stitches.

Ruffle

Row 1: (RS) Kfb, *K2tog, YO repeat from * to 2 sts before marker, K2tog, SM, YO, K1, YO, SM, *K2tog, YO repeat from *to last 3 sts, K2tog, Kfb. (271 sts)

Row 2: Kfb, K to last stitch, Kfb. Remove markers.

Row 3: Kfb every stitch

Row 4: Kfb, Knit to last stitch, Kfb

Row 5: (Kfb, K2) repeat to end

Row 6, 7, 8, 9: Knit every stitch Bind off loosely.

Abbreviations

K=Knit K2tog=Knit 2 stitches together (decrease 1) RS=Right Side YO=Bring yarn over needle (increase 1) Kfb=Knit into the front and the back of the same stitch (increase 1) PM=Place Marker, SM=Slip Marker, sts=stitches



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
