



# A River Runs Through Crochet Shawl

This shawl was designed for our 2018 Knit the River cruise!



## Instructions

Ch 8. Work a hdc into 4<sup>th</sup> chain from hook and remaining ch. Ch 3. Turn.

### Increase

**Row 1 (rs)** Hdc into front 3<sup>rd</sup> lp in each hdc, end with 2hdc in top of turning ch. Chain 4. Turn.

**Row 2 (ws):** Hdc in the 3<sup>rd</sup> lp in each hdc ending with hdc in top of turning chain. Chain 3. Turn.

Repeat **Row 1 & 2** until 42 Chain 4's have been created. Ending after working a **row 2**.

### Decrease

**Row 1 (rs)** Hdc into front 3<sup>rd</sup> lp in each hdc until 2 stitches remain. hdc dec in 3<sup>rd</sup> lp over next two stitches. End with hdc in top of turning ch. Chain 4. Turn.

**Row 2 (ws):** Hdc in the 3<sup>rd</sup> lp in each hdc ending with hdc in top of turning chain. Chain 3. Turn.

Repeat **Row 1 & 2** until 41 chain 4's have been created. Ending after working a **row 2**.

### Scalloped edge

Work 9 sc around each of the chain 4 down the length of the scarf. Weave in ends.

## Materials

**Yarn:** 1 skein, Sweet Georgia Tough Love Sock; 425yds/115g

**Color:** DKA Exclusive Color River

**Hook:** G

## Finished Size & Gauge

Approx 73" long x 10" wide at spine after blocking.

24 stitches in 4" in pattern.

## Abbreviations

**Ch** = Chain

**Rs** = Right side

**Ws** = Wrong side

**Hdc** = Half Double Crochet

**3<sup>rd</sup> Lp** = the front third loop under the top loops. It's made from the yo of the hdc.

**Sc** = single crochet

**dec** = decrease

Note – if using different yarn, work until you've used 45% of the yarn then decrease. Leaving at least 10% for edging.
