

Majestic Star

This petit shawl is perfect for cruising down the St. Croix River. The curved shawl is knit with stockinette and mesh sections.

Instructions

Cast on 3 stitches.

Setup Row: Kfb, Kfb, Kfb (6 stitches)

Stockinette Section: (mark right side with locking stitch marker)

Row 1: (RS) K1, YO, Kfb, knit until 2 stitches remain, Kfb, YO, K1.

(Increase of 4 stitches)

Row 2: (WS) K2, purl to last 2 stitches, k2.

Repeat **Stockinette Section** 12 more times. Work **Mesh Section** 3 times.

Mesh Section:

Row 1: (RS) K1, YO, Kfb, knit until 2 stitches remain, Kfb, YO, K1. (Increase of 4 stitches)

Row 2: (WS) K3 *YO, K2tog; repeat from * until 3 stitches remain, K3.

Work the **Stockinette Section** 8 times. Then work the **Mesh Section** 4 times.

Work the **Stockinette Section** 8 times. Then work the **Mesh Section** 5 times.

Work the **Stockinette Section** 8 times. Then work the **Mesh Section** 7 times.

Edging:

Work **Stockinette Section** 1 time. Then work **Row 1** of the Stockinette **Section** once.

Bind Off:

Work a loose bind off on the WS. You could work stitches loosely or have your right needle be several sizes larger.

K2togbl, place stitch on right hand needle to left needle; repeat from * to end. Fasten off. Weave in ends. Block mesh sections open. A steamer works great.



Materials

Yarn: 1 skein Lavender Lune Fingering;

437 yrds/100 grams.

Needles: US 7 32" circular

Notions: darning needle, locking stitch marker to mark right side of work.

Size & Gauge

19 sts and 9 rows = 4" stockinette

Blocked to 52" long and 15" deep.

Abbreviations

Kfb = Knit in front and back of stitch

 $\mathbf{K} = Knit$

YO = Yarn over

RS = Right side

WS = Wrong side

K2tog = Knit next two stitches together

K2togbl = Knit next two stitches together through the back loop.
