



# Easy Does It!

## Crochet era

### Instructions

---

Ch 4.

**Row 1:** HDC in 2nd ch from hook and across (3 HDC). Ch 1, turn.

**Row 2:** HDC in BLO across to last HDC, 2 HDC in last stitch.

**Row 3:** HDC in BLO across.

Repeat **rows 2-3** until you have used just less than half of your yarn then start the decrease rows.

#### Decrease Rows

**Row 4:** HDC in BLO across to last 2 HDC, HDC2tog.

**Row 5:** HDC in BLO across.

Repeat **rows 4-5** until you have 3 stitches remaining. Cast off.

### Before you begin

---

When starting row with chain 1, the first HDC tends to roll to the back of the work. Recommend counting stitches regularly to make sure you are getting into all of the HDC of the row.



### Materials

---

**Yarn:** 860 yards of fingering weight yarn. Sample made with Laine du Nord Paint Gradient Sock

**Hook:** US D/3.5mm

### Gauge and Size

---

22 HDC x 16 rows to 4 inches

13.5" deep x 95" length blocked

### Abbreviations

---

**Ch** = Chain

**HDC** = Half Double Crochet

**BLO** = back loop only

**HDCtog** = YO, insert hook into next stitch and pull up a loop, YO and pull yarn through 2 loops, YO, insert hook into next stitch and pull up a loop, YO and pull yarn through 2 loops (should have 4 loops remaining on hook), YO and pull through remaining 4 loops.
