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pattern

Petrichor

Petrichor is the earthy, pleasant scent produced when rain falls on dry soil.

Instructions

Cast on 51 stitches with long tail cast on.

Set up row (rs): sl1wyif, k1, ssk, k20, kfb, pm, k1, pm, kfb, k20, k2tog, k2.

Row 1 (ws): sl1wyif, knit to end.

Row 1 (rs): sl1wyif, k1, ssk, k20, kfb, sm, k1, sm, kfb, k20, k2tog, k2.

Repeat **Row 1 and Row 2** until the desired length.

One way to keep track of which row you are on is to mark the RS with a locking stitch marker or bit of yarn. Or, if you did a long tail cast on, then your tail and working yarn will be on the same side of the needle when you are about to work a right side.

Bind off loosely; weave in ends.



Materials

Yarn: 2 balls Juniper Moon Farm Cumulus Matisse; 251 yards/100grams

Needles: US 10

Gauge and Size

Approx 70" long x 8" wide
15 stitches = 4" in chevron pattern

Abbreviations

RS = right side of scarf

WS = wrong side of scarf

Sl1wyif = slip one stitch purlwise with yarn in front.

K = knit

SSK = slip one stitch knitwise, slip another stitch knitwise, knit both stitches together

Pm = place marker

Sm = Slip Marker

K2tog = knit two stitches together.
