



Fun and Gaymes:

The Heated Rivalry Edit

Instructions

Cast on 112 stitches in MC. Place a beginning-of-round marker and begin working in the round. [K1, P1] for 1 1/4"

Increase round: (k13, kfb) 8 times. Increase to 120 stitches. Change to larger needles.

Working Charts - Lettering Hat : Begin working chart A. Work the first five rows of the chart. Then for the next eight rows work each round across chart B, then across chart C, then work chart D - repeat chart D until the end of the round. [Continue working lettering charts in that order \(row 2 of B, row 2 of chart C, row 2 of chart D, repeating this four stitch row until the BOR.](#) After completing round 45 of the chart proceed to the crown decreases.

Crown Decreases

Row 1: Knit 10, k2tog repeat to end (110 stitches)

Row 2 and every even row: Knit

Row 3: Knit 9, k2tog repeat to end (100 stitches)

Row 5: Knit 8, k2tog repeat to end (90 stitches)

Row 7: Knit 7, k2tog repeat to end (80 stitches)

Row 9: Knit 6, k2tog repeat to end (70 stitches)

Row 11: Knit 5, k2tog repeat to end (60 stitches)

Row 13: Knit 4, k2tog repeat to end (50 stitches)

Row 15: Knit 3, k2tog repeat to end (40 stitches)

Row 17: Knit 2, k2tog repeat to end (30 stitches)

Row 19: Knit 1, k2tog repeat to end (20 stitches)

Row 21: k2tog to end (10 stitches)

Row 23: k2tog to end (5 stitches)

Draw yarn through last 5 stitches, cinch, and weave in end.



Materials

Yarn: 5 skeins of Cascade 220 Sport, 164/50 grams (each hat uses 3 colors) - colors shown are 8505 White, 8895 Christmas Red, 7827 Goldenrod, 7818 Blue Velvet, 8555 Black

Needles: US 5 & 6, 16" circular and US 6 DPNs or 32" circular for Magic Loop

Notions: tapestry needle, stitch marker

Gauge: 28 sts = 4"

Size

This hat fits an average sized adult head. 20 - 23". To adjust the size of your hat, either larger or smaller, see the note section on page 2.

Abbreviations

K - Knit

P - Purl

sts - stitches

kfb - knit front back

k2tog - knit two together





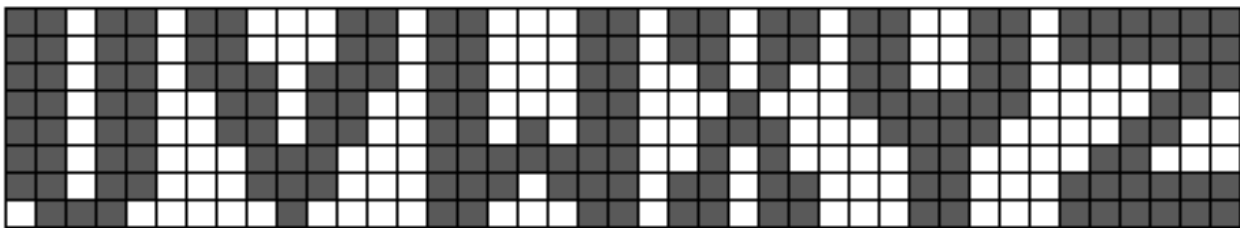
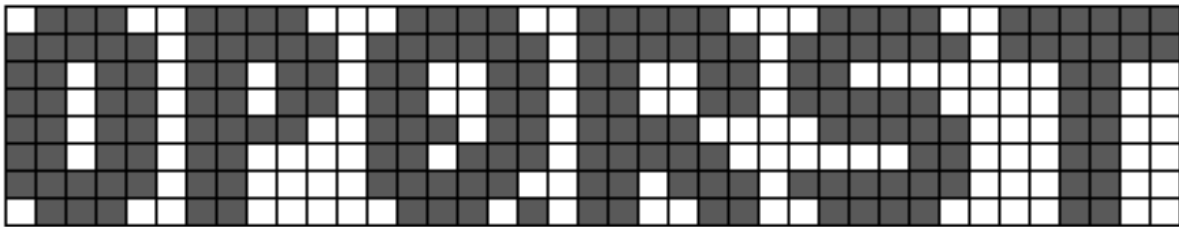
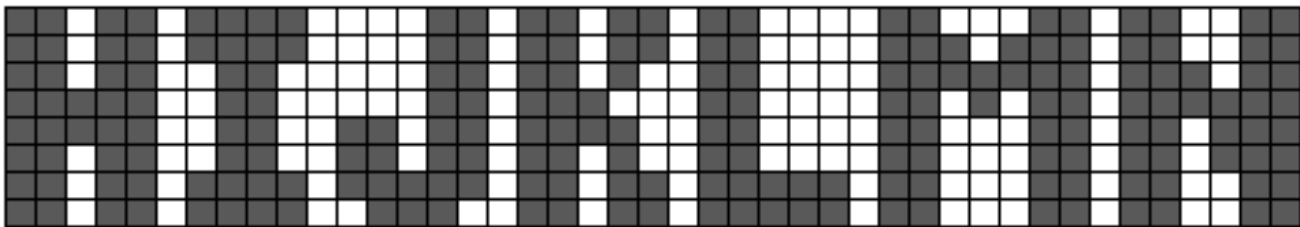
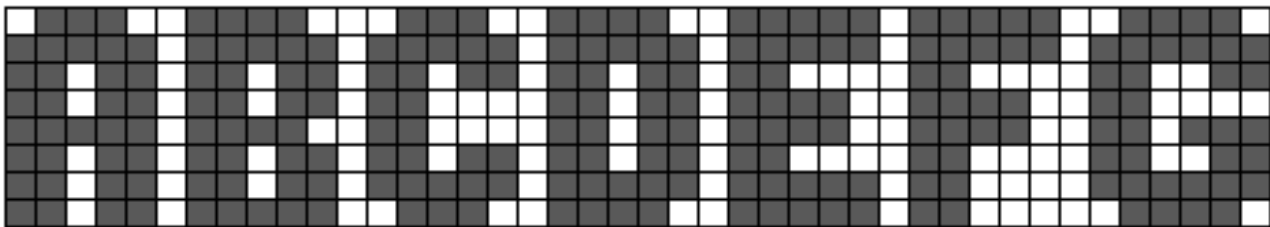
Notes – See next page for charts

For lettering charts - use your main color (whichever you cast on with) for the background of the letters.

For a smaller hat cast on 104 stitches, then work your ribbing and work your increase round as follows: (k12, kfb) 8 times. Increased to 112 stitches.

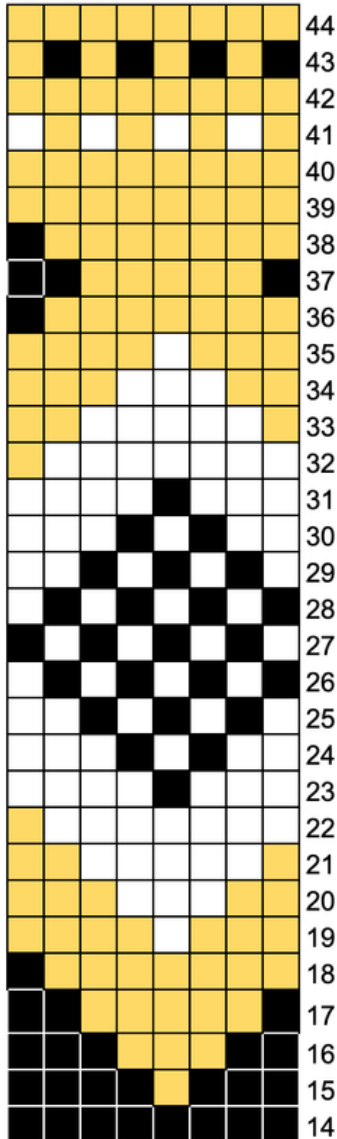
For a larger hat cast on 120 stitches, then work your ribbing and work your increase row as follows: (k14, kfb) 8 times. Increased to 128 stitches. Or knit original pattern on a larger needle.

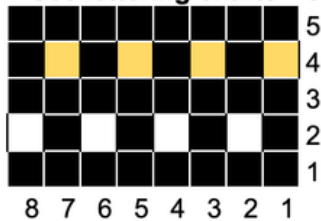
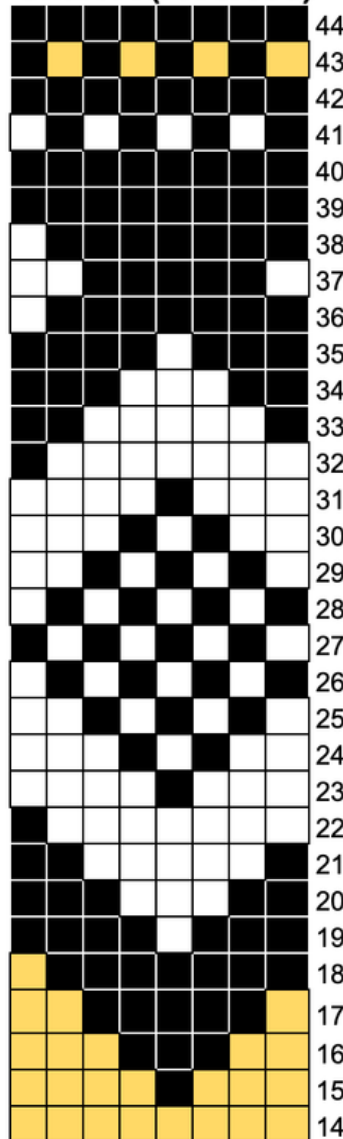


Chart A (reversed)
